

Executive Order 14305

Restoring American Airspace Sovereignty

June 6, 2025

Overview

Released on June 6, 2025, [Executive Order 14305](#): Restoring American Airspace Sovereignty. The Order address the growing threat posed by Drones/Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) used by criminal, terrorist, and hostile foreign actors. This order is issued to ensure control over the national airspace and protect the public, critical infrastructure, mass gathering events, and military and sensitive government installations and operations from threat posed by careless or unlawful use of UAS.

Directives

Federal Aviation Administration	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The agency must immediately submit Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) to the OMB and the Task Force to restrict drone flights over fixed-site facilities, alongside begin coordination for national security assessments with SRMSs, DOD, DHS, and DOJ Within 60 days (Aug 5, 2025) the agency must provide automated real-time access to personal identify information from UAS remote ID signals to federal and SLTT agencies, and coordinate with DHS and SRMS to publish guidance from private infrastructure owners on drone detection technologies Within 180 days (Dec 3, 2025) the agency must make NOTAMs and TFRs freely available online in open format for done geofencing and navigations
Department of Justice/Attorney General	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Attorney General must constantly submit legislative proposals to revise criminal penalties for violations of restricted airspace Within 30 days (July 6, 2025) the agency shall ensure DOJ grants programs permit SLTT agencies to purchase UAS detection equipment, as well as explore integrating counter-UAS operations into the Joint Terrorism Task Forces for mass gatherings Within 90 days (Sep 4, 2025) the Attorney General shall submit a recommendation to the president on designating protect areas under federal law
Department of Homeland Security	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Within 30 days (July 6, 2025) the agency must ensure DHS grant programs to support SLTT drone detections Within 60 days (Aug 5, 2025) the agency must Co-publish guidance with FAA for private sector drone detection Within 90 days (Sep 4, 2025) the agency must co-submit recommendations on protect area designations
Federal Communication Commission	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Within 30 days (July 6, 2025) the agency must participate in revising the August 2020 Advisory on drone detection technologies

What Does This Mean for Government?

The EO will provide an opportunity for vendors that specialize in drones/UAS, cybersecurity, and surveillance can expect to see an increased level of potential opportunities stemming from the Executive Order. As the federal guidance will be published by August 5th, 2025, to help infrastructure owners choose and deploy said technologies

State, Local, Tribal, and Territorial agencies will be provided the opportunity to apply for an increased numbers of grants provided by the Department of Justice and Homeland Security. Vendors should prepare to engage with state and local government seeking compliant solutions funded by federal grants.
