In fact, 46% of benefit decision makers noted direct access to applicant income data as their primary need.¹

The Challenge With Verifications

Social service agencies often struggle with:

Outdated Information:

Relying on pay stubs, tax returns, or public source data like state quarterly wage data may not reflect an applicant's current financial situation.



Data from public sources can be anywhere from 30-120 days old.²

Manual Processes:

Time-consuming manual verification steps, especially for self-employed workers (e.g., gathering and tabulating ledgers, business records, etc.) can increase administrative burden and the potential for human error.



Manual income verification can take weeks, delaying much-needed assistance.

Delays and Errors:

The need for manual verification and the increased likelihood of errors can lead to delayed provision of critical benefits to those in urgent need.



48% of surveyed applicants say they worry about making errors in the application.³

Need for income data for gig/self employed:

Social Service agencies must now verify the income of applicants from a variety of sources, including traditional W-2 jobs and 1099/gig work.



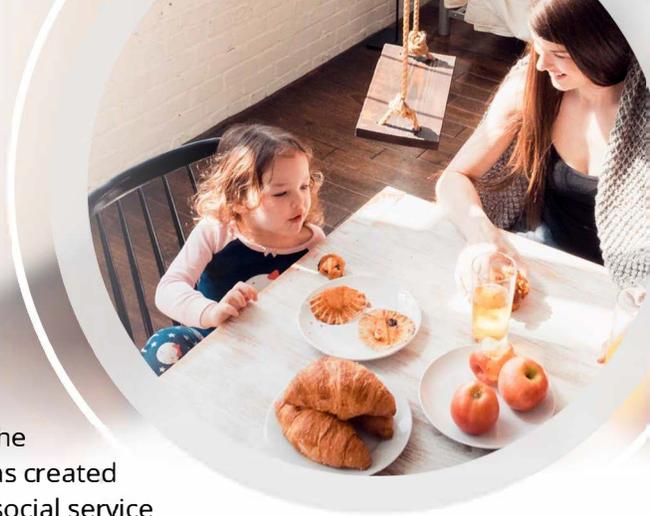
An Equifax study conducted in May 2025, found that: 7 of out of 10 managers in social service agencies lack access to records of income earned outside of traditional employment.⁴
