Two sides of discrimination in corporate America

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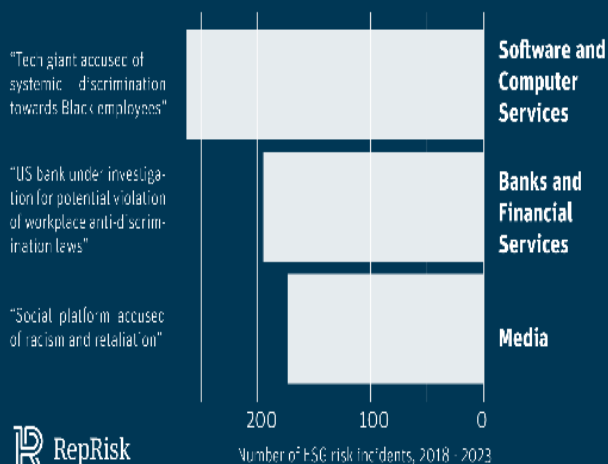
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On International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination, Reprisk reviewed the data on what discrimination looks like for companies in the US, within their walls and beyond. In recent years, software and computer services in the US have been repeatedly linked to discrimination in employment, incidents of treating people differently within a workplace setting. Of the sectors reviewed, banks and financial services companies were most often linked to social discrimination, referring to inequitable treatment of the customers or communities they serve.

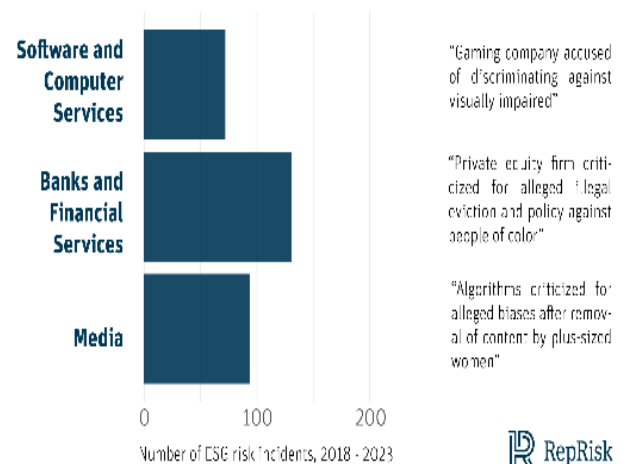
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INTERNAL TO COMPANY | DISCRIMINATION IN EMPLOYMENT



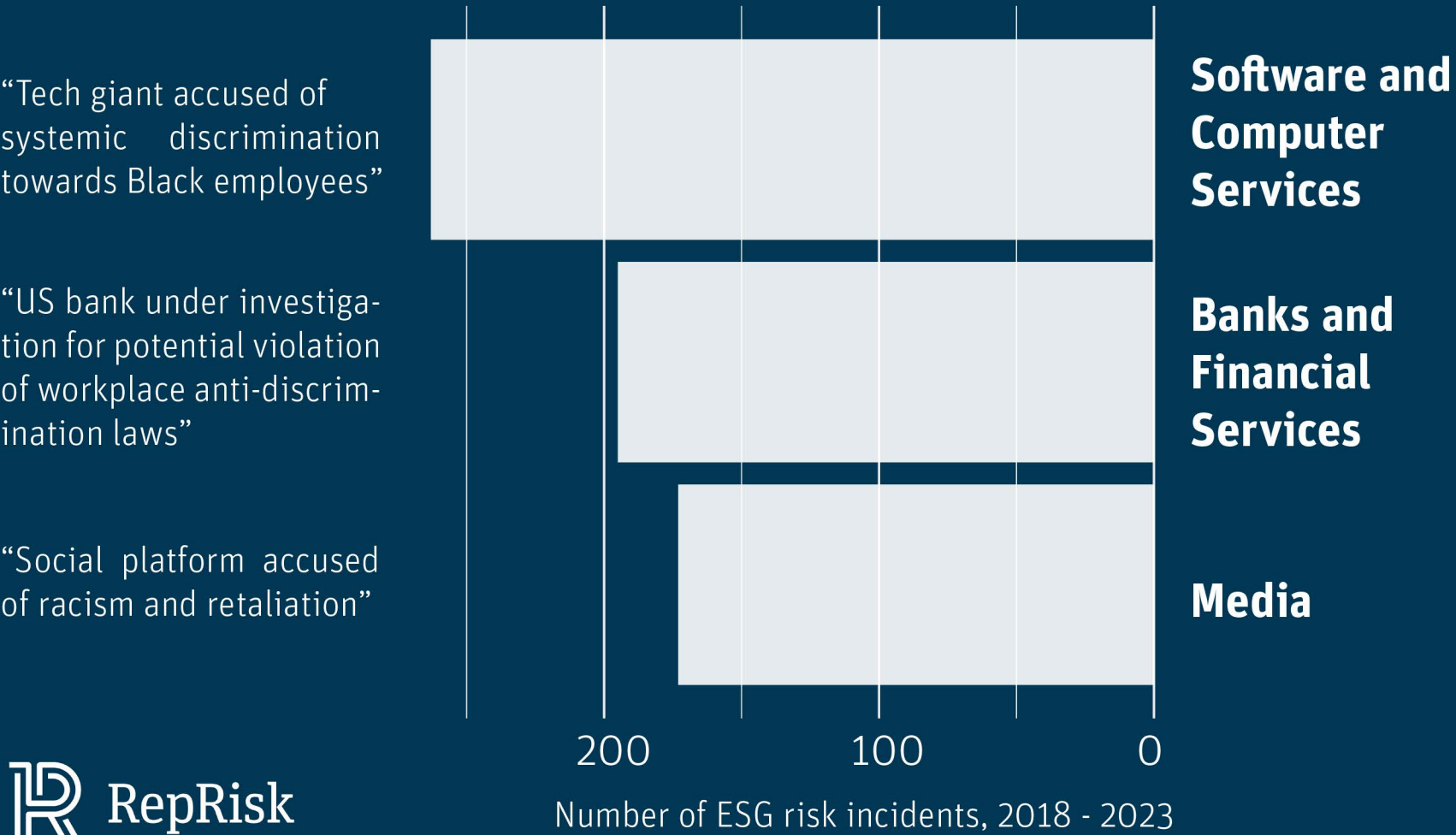
EXTERNAL TO COMPANY | SOCIAL DISCRIMINATION



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
